Firefighter 2 Course Descriptions

Firefighter 2 is designed for the student to build upon skills learned in BEFO w/ HMFRO and SCBA/IFO courses. Taken from IFSTA Essentials of Fire Fighting 7th Edition and NFPA 1001, this course will help the student develop skills as a team leader within their company and lay the foundation of becoming a fire service company officer. Course topics include crew leadership, basic passenger vehicle rescue, risk reduction, foam firefighting, flammable liquids and gas, and inspection, maintenance, and assisting technical rescue. This course is offered as a modular series:

- 2024 FF2 Module 1 - Crew Leadership (w/o Structural Live Fire) **OR**
- 2024 FF2 Module 1A - Crew Leadership (w/ Structural Live Fire)
- 2024 FF2 Module 2 - Risk Reduction
- 2024 FF2 Module 3 - Foam & Flammable Gas
- 2024 FF2 Module 4 - IMAT

Prerequisites: Basic Exterior Firefighter Operations (BEFO) or equivalent, Training Authorization Letter (TAL)

FF2 Module 2 - Risk Reduction is designed for the student to build upon skills learned in BEFO w/ HMFRO. This course is based upon the requirements found in Chapter 5 of NFPA 1001, Standard for Fire Fighter Professional Qualifications. Educational topics include emergency planning and community risk reduction. Skills training includes pre-incident planning, fire safety surveys and fire safety presentations.
