Firefighter Survival: Self Rescue

The Firefighter Survival: Self Rescue course is based on the individual job performance requirements from NFPA 1407. Course content will enable firefighters to recognize fire ground conditions that contribute to firefighter disorientation and/or entrapment, to have knowledge of what is necessary to ensure their safety and that of their partners or crew members, and to call a MAY DAY, and perform self-rescue techniques when disoriented, separated, or when needing to exit a structure in an emergency. This course requires students to perform a number of practical evolutions with self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) and includes both horizontal and vertical self-rescue skills utilized for egress.

Prerequisites: Firefighter I (or equivalent). Students must also possess a current medical clearance and fit test for SCBA use and be physically capable of wearing an SCBA. Students not meeting these requirements will not be allowed to participate for their own safety.

Applicable Standards: based on the individual job performance requirements of NFPA 1407 Standard for Training Fire Service Rapid Intervention Crews.

This class is a prerequisite to Firefighter Survival: Conducting Emergency Escape System Training for Company Officers and the new version of Rapid Intervention Crew – the replacement for FAST.
